They said to go ahead and use it but with the statement that a generation would be harmed using the bad information until they can get a correct understanding in place. That was a 2013 statement at the time the DSM and DSM category of Autism was thrown out, not being able to replicate in clinical trials the symptoms and category. The DSM is using or thinking the idea of dimensions, degrees of a dimension of something where any two persons are not alike.

People are not grouped accurately in the old category of "autism", the symptoms grouping are not correct, the symptoms being given out. Molly talks about Colby Price. He is 5. At 18 months he was placed in the category. His mom saw another friend with a son and watched for the signs she was told would happen. He has two older sisters. She took him into a center to have him tested at 15 months. She knew he was going to have it as her friend's son did. She began his sessions with a therapist in her home. He has been through continual therapists. He was not intellectually less than others but had lower social skill behaviors. He has seen a speech and occupational therapist, ABA therapy, a therapist in another city, a speech therapist, and an early childhood teacher at the elementary.

My best friend was from Charlotte. We had different abilities. I learned to sew in the 4th grade. I made all my clothes. My friend and I made a dress together in the 7th grade. We made matching pink dresses. We had a sewing class together. She was my best friend. We were both very smart. We had different abilities, however. We had different dimensions of talents. Although I had been sewing continually since the 4th grade, in the 7th grade my friend got A's on her sewing class tasks and had never made anything. I was a designer. She was more obsessive compulsive. Every seam was perfectly straight. We had different dimensions of a trait which is how the National Institute of Mental Health is talking about this idea of what is being called autism. In looking at all the research they are not seeing this as a valid category or disability, they are choosing it to be more of a degree of a dimension and in norm populations, rather than a sickness clinical diagnosis model.

My friend, Denise, had a different personality makeup. The dimensions or degrees of the dimension were different than mine. I believe we have the same dimensions, just different degrees. Although I had more experience with sewing and got a job in a fabric shop advising women on their projects, she was much more exact in her straight seams and so got A's on all her sewing tasks.

My ex made the most perfect cabinet drops the building inspector had ever seen. Were they necessary? No. It took months for him to perfect them. It's nice to have perfectly straight seams, in fact we demand it, but people have different degrees of a dimension like in sewing and perfect cabinet

Children may enjoy music, Dawn R. Mitchell White, of the **University of South Florida**, says. She talks about her 3 teenage sons she involved in music from an early age, and who have been placed in high functioning or smart kids who are not as socially skilled. She is a music teacher and works with kids K-12 with learning and other disabilities. She talks about children who have talent and who may also be not as socially skilled. The CBS video about Rex Lewis-Clark, a 13-year-old with repetitive behaviors, who has piano skill, shows this. The Lew-Clark boy was born with blindness issues and water on the brain, physical problems.

She suggests singing to improve language skills.

My son was having trouble talking. He was behind in talking by 1 ½ at age 5. He had 4 adults in the home that responded immediately to his expressions and gestures. I held him back a grade, his birthday was close to the line. Someone from the University came to work with him. She used M&M's. He was not speaking at all. The first day he was saying words. The second day he was saying sentences. He was actually gifted in speaking, he just had not chosen to do that. It was not necessary. He was ahead of other kids, the class leader, confident, funny, capable. The other moms wanted to meet me, the mother of this boy in the class that was so impressive. He had not chosen to speak. I never considered him to be defective, I thought it might be the problem what was found to be the problem.

CBS has another child video of a 4-year old who was not talking but started to sing.

NIMH video, I put together

I have a video I put together in what is being said that I got by the past director 2002-2021 (20 years) of NIMH, what is being labeled as autism.

What I'm reading is they are not seeing autism as a disease, a sickness, but a combination of dimensions. No two persons are alike. They want to look at normal functioning and see degrees. He previously stated it is harmful to do the testing, the diagnosing, the system is not right. They need to build a new car. **Thomas Insel** (2002 – 2015) went to Google to look at new technology. **Bruce Cuthbert** (2015-2016) said they should not be using categories like ADHD, autism, but dimensions. We are not animals, he said. He talked about animal studies.

ABA is based on animal studies.

I was newly graduated from studying psychology and sociology and child and family developmental studies. I began to have children. I had one son who did not pick up on the bike, yet. He was distressed trying to learn to ride. My oldest son was the same way. He took the bike out he got for Christmas and brought it back. "This doesn't work", he said, as he threw it to the ground. My younger son was the same. I had a model on the bulletin board, a very large model of training using behavior modification or ABA. I had learned this. I began working with my son using ABA to ride the bike. I got the feeling, as a parent, that I was being disrespectful of my son (the same thing the husband of the woman starting Autism clinics all over Utah, said to me privately when I went to research the centers in Utah). It was Pavlovian dog studies that started our understanding of ABA. It was studies of rats and mice and dogs, like in the rats of Nimh, the Secret of Nimh.* I felt I was being disrespectful of my son in using ABA. I pulled the training papers from the wall.

This is what Bruce Cuthbert said. He said, we are not animals. I don't remember ever trying to teach my son to ride the bike, again. He did learn how to do it. I don't know when. He taught himself. Bruce Cuthbert says, we are not animals.

He said they were looking at the dimensions, how they function. He is interested in collecting huge amounts of data from all sources (including technology). He talked about the European foundation of Mental Health or Freud, that America is using, that much of the world does not see it that way. Freud is a sick model of behaving, everyone is sick. If you see a psychologist, they will find something wrong with you. NIMH is interested in observable models (not necessarily the testing), but where we observe the dimension. What are the dimensions we are looking for, he said? He doesn't like reductionism, reducing to simplicity. He wants to know the valid measures of the dimensions. We do not have it figured out, he said. He said we need to start over, and not use the DSM. It's not getting us where we need to go. They are hoping grants to researchers will bring something. He was looking for a new model that was not based on pathology (or sickness). It's harmful, they said (in 2013), the diagnostic, symptom model. Thomas Insel stated, it is "harmful to the individual, to the family, and to the community". That leaves them without a model to give the psychology majors pouring out of universities. It was stated in 2013, that in using the old system, a whole generation would be harmed. Pressure was put on them to have a system, so they said to go ahead and use the old one. They want a population health frame, instead of this diagnostic treatment model. It's more of a health focus.

(2016-2021) Joshua Gordon, the new director, is looking at researchers, saying we want to take all the data and see what it leads to, the understanding. He is looking for the understanding, saying he didn't think they would find it.
